Maybe you have also wondered

Why in the world would a busy, successful endodontist want to learn about and place implants?

An increasing number of cases that are referred to my practice involve teeth with a questionable restorative prognosis. It's not a question of whether endodontic treatment can be done, but of the ability to predictably retain the tooth with crown and bridge and how long that patient can expect to enjoy full function. In many cases, it involves evaluating endodontic treatment options and the alternatives to endodontic intervention, which is removal of the tooth, and replacement options.

Of course, the best way to help patients is not limited to what I had been trained to do in my endodontic residency. I believe that by having knowledge and experience in both endodontics and implant dentistry I will be in the best position to provide excellent care to patients and offer them the most predictable, long-term solutions for them to maintain their function and health. Endodontists have followed the research and watched our surgical colleagues manage the challenges of implant placement for more than twenty years.

The AAE is now training endodontists to be successful partners with our restorative dentists to help patients maintain healthy function for a lifetime, including endodontic an surgical treatment. My standards dictated more knowledge and training, which led me to participate in a 12 month Residency Maxi-Course in Implant Dentistry at Loma Linda University in southern California, which I completed last year, along with successfully completing (and passing!) the written board exam for the American Academy of Implant Dentistry.

New technology is now available to improve the accuracy of implant placement with the use of Cone beam CT 3D Imaging and 3D Guided Surgery stints. I believe this technology provides both the surgeon and the restorative dentist a huge advantage with respect to the predictability of the overall outcome (In some states, this is now considered to be standard of care). We now have this technology in our office and it will be extremely useful for diagnosis, planning and treatment for not just implant cases, but for many other phases of dentistry as well. If you are a restorative dentist, endodontist, periodontist, pedodontist, oral surgeon or orthodontist, this technology will enhance your ability to diagnose and treat your patients in an accurate, revolutionary 3-dimensional way.
