
Consistent with the jurisdictional markup meetings held on May 24th, 2011, and November 3rd, 2011, the forklifts are assigned as follows:

Dear Jay,

The claim by Kiewit in the "Forklifts" letter, dated 3/20/12, that "all forklift work on the project including the support for subcontractors and sub tier subcontractors is the scope of work of the primary contractor Kiewit Power Constructors" and "All other forklift work will be the work of the Operating Engineers" is unacceptable. There are numerous issues with this work assignment that will impact our ability to complete our scope of work.

Our first issue is the trade specific duties that our forklift operator is responsible for on a day to day basis. These duties include, not only operation of the forklift to place our material and equipment but also as the role of lead tender foreman which has the responsibility of planning and directing the tenders day to day activities. To complete the planning of tender activities the forklift operator needs to have the knowledge of the trade and our site operations in order to direct and place material and equipment ahead of the bricklayer force that is constructing the building. Having to direct a forklift operator that is unfamiliar with our work will not only cause a cost impact to our work but also creates a safety hazard due to that operator not being familiar with the material and equipment which are specific to our trade and not having the knowledge of how to place these loads on our scaffolding which has certain load points where the loads are required to be placed.

The safety issue of having an operator who is unfamiliar with our work is a major concern. Our forklift operators are trained and certified through the laborers union. This training is inclusive of not only the forklift operations but also the picking, hoisting and placing of equipment and materials specific to our trade onto scaffolding which is also specific to our trade. There are instances that happen on every project throughout the day where the forklift operator will need to hoist materials in and out in close proximity of our personnel. Having a forklift operator who is unfamiliar and untrained in our line of work will put our personnel and the personnel of other trades in the area in harms way.

These cost impacts and safety issues will prevent me from having an operator who is not a part of our union and who is not familiar with our trade work.

Jay,

I forwarded you two emails from the laborers union representative. There is no way that we could use a forklift operator from the Operators due to trade specific operations which they are not familiar with and with the Operators unfamiliarity with our trade, there is a safety issue with having an operator run a forklift while performing our work as well as a cost issue. In our line of work the forklift operator is also used as our lead tender foreman for the project who performs various duties which are specific to our trade. This person does planning for the scaffold building and material mobilization while onsite. An Operators Union worker will not be able to perform these duties. This claim to our work was not brought up by the operators union at our meeting. The only issue which was discussed was having an operator run any crane used onsite. We will not be using a crane so this was not a concern for us. As of right now I am leaving this issue up to our union representative but to inform you I cannot use an operator who is untrained in our line of work to run a forklift for my crew.

Work assigned to the laborers:


