NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Under the terms of the current Master Labor Agreement covering 11 Southern California Counties and Amendment dated June 2nd, 2014 between the Southern California District Council of Laborers and the Associated General Contractors, Building Industry Association, Engineering Contractors Association and the Southern California Contractors Association which increased the rate by \$0.05 per hour for the duration of the Master Labor Agreement from \$1.75 to \$1.80 effective July 1, 2014, the allocation is as follows: \$ 1.20 per hour to wages, \$.22 per hour to vacation, \$.25 per hour to Pension, \$.03 per hour to Laborers Trust' Administrative Trust Fund and \$.10 per hour to Partnership for Jobs Industry Advancement Fund.

The minimum hourly base wage rates and classifications appear on pages 2, 3 and 4.

Foremen: Laborer Foremen employed in accordance with the Agreement shall be paid not less than \$1.75 per hour more than the hourly wage rate of the highest Laborer over which they have leadership on their regular crew. In the event the Contractor, at his option, elects to use a Laborer Foreman to supervise other Laborer Foremen, he shall be paid not less than \$1.00 per hour more than the hourly rate of the highest classified Laborer Foreman over whom he has leadership.

Overtime: Time and one-half, except hours worked over 12 in a single workday, Sundays and holidays, which are double (2) time.

Subsistence: Subsistence shall be paid at the rate of \$45.00 per scheduled workday. Subsistence as provided in the Agreement shall be paid on jobs on the following offshore islands:
